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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The National Institutes of Health write, “To improve human health, scientific discoveries must be translated into practical applications.” In the field of behavioral and community health, translational research helps to move findings in empirical studies more quickly and effectively into everyday practice, creating more meaningful outcomes for persons with mental illnesses, substance abuse disorders, and developmental and cognitive disabilities. One of the challenges of translational research in behavioral and community health is strengthening collaboration among multiple disciplines, integrating data and standards seamlessly to work toward a better understanding of the complex causes of disorders and creating effective prevention, detection, and treatments. In this year’s report on scholarly activities, we see how the faculty and staff of the College of Behavioral and Community Sciences have incorporated translational research into the academy and community.

During 2009, 524 scholarly activities were conducted by the faculty and staff of FMHI. FMHI faculty and staff published 162 articles in 86 refereed journals and 4 non-refereed journals. Almost a fifth of the journals (19%; n=17) were in the top ten in impact factor in their respective subject categories, with 8 of the titles cross-listed in both the *Journal Citation Reports Science* and *Social Sciences* editions. FMHI faculty and staff authored or edited 10 monographs and authored 45 book chapters with 25 academic presses. FMHI faculty and staff also authored 53 legislative, state agency, granting agency, professional organization, or federal reports. FMHI faculty and staff attended 104 conferences: 15 international, 56 national or federal, 3 regional, 27 state, and 3 local conferences and presented or conducted a total of 254 presentations: papers (181), posters (51), panels (1), symposia (6), keynotes (2), and workshops (13).

To compare FMHI’s role in the College of Behavioral and Community Sciences (CBCS), CBCS faculty and staff published 298 journal articles in 156 refereed journals and 55 non-refereed journals. Of the 156 refereed journals, almost a quarter of all faculty publications (24%; n=38), are in the top ten journals in impact factor. 13 titles are indexed in both the *Journal Citation Reports Science* and *Social Sciences* editions. CBCS faculty and staff authored or were the editors of twenty-two monographs and authored one hundred and sixteen book chapters with 48 academic presses. CBCS faculty authored 58 technical reports. CBCS faculty and staff attended 169 conferences: 36 international, 76 national or federal, 4 regional, 45 state, and 8 local conferences and presented or conducted a total of 402 presentations: papers (294), posters (80), panels (3), symposia (10), and workshops (18).

JOURNAL ARTICLES

162 journal articles were written or accepted for publication in 86 refereed journals and four non-refereed journals (Appendix 1).

Of the 86 refereed journals, almost a fifth of all faculty publications (19%; n=17), are in the top ten journals in impact factor in their respective subject categories (Table 1). These journals are: *American Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry*, *American Journal of Public Health*, *Children & Youth Services Review*, *The Gerontologist*, *International Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry*, *International Psychogeriatrics*, *Journal of Behavioral Medicine*, *Journal of Clinical Psychiatry*, *Journal of Consulting & Clinical Psychology*, *American Journal of Public Health*, *Journal of Emotional & Behavioral Disorders*, *Journal of Positive Behavior Interventions*, *Journal of the American Geriatrics Society*, *Journals of Gerontology: Series B: Psychological Sciences & Social Sciences*, *Medical Decision Making*, *Psychiatric Services*, and *Research in Developmental Disabilities*.

In addition, 8 titles are indexed in both the *Journal Citation Reports Science* and *Social Sciences* editions (Table 2). These journals are: *American Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry*, *Applied Nursing Research*, *International Journal of Geriatric Psychiatry*, *Journal of Clinical Psychiatry*, *Journal of the American Geriatrics Society*, *Journals of Gerontology: Series B: Psychological Sciences & Social Sciences*, and *Psychiatric Services*.

The *Social Sciences edition* subject categories for these cross-edition journals are: GERONTOLOGY; PSYCHIATRY; HEALTH POLICY & SERVICES; PUBLIC, ENVIRONMENTAL & OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH; PSYCHOLOGY, CLINICAL; PSYCHOLOGY, EXPERIMENTAL; AND NURSING;

The *Sciences edition* subject categories for these journals are: GERIATRICS & GERONTOLOGY; PSYCHIATRY; HEALTH CARE SCIENCES & SERVICES; PUBLIC, ENVIRONMENTAL & OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH; PSYCHOLOGY; and NURSING.

If we look at the subject categories for all the journals across both editions (Table 3), the categories in which FMHI faculty published most heavily in 2009 are PSYCHOLOGY (ALL, 21), GERONTOLOGY/GERIATRICS & GERONTOLOGY (8), PSYCHIATRY (6), HEALTH POLICY & SERVICES / HEALTH CARE SCIENCES & SERVICES (5), PUBLIC, ENVIRONMENTAL & OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH (5), FAMILY STUDIES (6), EDUCATION, SPECIAL (4), SOCIAL WORK (3), REHABILITATION (2), NURSING (2), and SUBSTANCE ABUSE (2).

Due to the interdepartmental collaboration on articles, the total count of refereed articles by department will not equal the total count of refereed journal articles. Breakout by department is as follows:

INSTITUTE TECHNICAL REPORTS AND SERIES

The College also authored 54 legislative, state agency, granting agency, professional organization, or federal reports (included in publications list, appendix 1). Of these, nine reports were delivered to Florida's Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) as part of its multi-year contract. Additional reports evaluated county-wide human services, behavioral and educational frameworks, health overlay services, natural helper programs, and transitional programs for youth, Medicaid populations and programs, family health literacy, community-based mental health waivers, inpatient programs, transitional services, and programmatic needs assessments. BCS faculty also worked with faculty from University of Oregon, the American Psychological Association Committee on Aging's Working Group on Multicultural Competency in Geropsychology, and interdepartmentally.

Its 22nd annual research conference proceedings: *A system of care for children's mental health: Expanding the research base* had four chapters authored by BCS faculty and staff.

CONFERENCE PRESENTATIONS

In 2009, FMHI faculty and staff attended 104 conferences: 15 international, 56 national or federal, 3 regional, 27 state, and 3 local conferences and presented or conducted a total of 254 presentations: papers (181), posters (51), panels (1), symposia (6), keynotes (2), and workshops (13).

Faculty attended international conferences across Europe (Spain, France, the Czech Republic), North America (Canada: Ontario and Quebec), and in Asia (Taiwan), as well as international conferences hosted this year in the United States. In addition to national conferences, FMHI faculty and staff attended federal conferences sponsored by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, National Institutes of Health, and the Department of Education Office of Special Education Programs.
